It's Outta Here!

The 2017 baseball season will be remembered as the year of the home run.

Players hit 6,104 home in 2017. This slammed the previous record of the 2000 season, which totaled 5,693 home runs.

To understand this drastic increase in homers, researchers have conducted CT scans on game balls. They've investigated baseballs from before and after the start of the surge.

They might have the answer.

Investigations prove that the core of the new baseballs is an average of 0.5 grams lighter than the old ones. A less dense core allows baseballs to fly about 6 inches farther.

Lighter baseballs mean that a lot more players are knocking it out of the park.
